<u>First Item of Business:</u> Council discussed ways to better communicate with the community. Because that was the biggest complaint during the well failure was better communication. The council decided that posting on the city's Facebook page would be helpful, but that for mor detailed info that community members could be directed to the city webpage from Facebook. The council also asked to look over the water ordinance at the next meeting so that they can add a requirement to have emergency contact for all water users, in the event that we need to get info out like we did with the well failure.

<u>Second Item of Business:</u> Brett brough to the council a request from the museum in which they wanted to know if the city would hand out home tour maps to people who come into town looking for information. The council discussed it and decided that if the museum wanted to provide that information they could, but the city doesn't get a lot of requests for that kind of thing.

Third Item of Business: Jared had another meeting with IMC and Kloepher about 1900 South. Jared was able to get Oakley moved up in line for the LHTAC grant. The deadline for the application is in December, so Jared will work on that and if it Oakley was awarded that grant it wouldn't be funded till next October. IMC and Kloepher are putting together bids for that project and would like the city to put up a third of that cost, which we would use the grant money for. The bid would be to construct a road that is rated for 129,000 lbs.
